Community Meeting

The meeting aimed to unite the community, allowing organizations to showcase their work, discuss common challenges, and explore opportunities for stronger partnerships, all to better serve the English-speaking population of the Outaouais.

Focus Groups to **Connect & Better Understand** the Needs of our Community

With funding from the Secrétariat aux relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise, Connexions hosted nine focus groups — five in the MRC Pontiac (Shawville, Campbell's Bay, Otter Lake, Portage-du-Fort, Upper Pontiac) and four in the MRC des Collines-de-l'Outaouais (Chelsea, Wakefield, Cantley, Vals-des-Monts). These groups explored community needs on topics such as health and well-being, social life and education, economy, and environment. Connexions will release a full report detailing the findings in the coming year.



Supporting Early Childhood **Development**

Connexions' series of Parent-Child Dyad Workshops and Speech Language Webinars, led by Speech-Language Therapists (SLPs), provided hands-on help for **25 children** aged 0-5 who had speech, language, or communication delays or disabilities. We are grateful to the CISSS de l'Outaouais for partnering with us to refer families to these sessions.

Our Parent Resource Series, which included participation from families, school staff, and professionals who work with children, featured expert speakers from the Western Québec School Board, the CISSS de l'Outaouais and community organizations, who offered information on their service offerings and available resources.

Our fun family-oriented activities, which included drumming with dads and their children, created engaging experiences for all.

School Transition **Kits**

Connexions produced 800 School Transition Kits for English-speaking families of the Outaouais to help them prepare their child for the transition from home or daycare to school, thereby promoting school success.

Connexions collaborated with the Western Quebec School Board (WQSB) to develop the Kits, with funding provided by Centraide Outaouais.



Let's **Play & Talk** Kits

Thanks to funding from the CISSS de l'Outaouais, Connexions produced 216 Let's Play & Talk Kits designed for children aged 3-5. Each kit includes engaging learning activities that encourage parent-child play, language development, and early literacy.

These kits were distributed to the CISSS de l'Outaouais for use by their social workers and speech-language therapists, as well as to BIBLIO-Outaouais, enabling

families throughout the Outaouais to borrow these kits from their local library.

Mental Health Influencer Internship

Connexions continued its initiative to promote youth mental health with another round of the Youth Mental Health Influencer Internship.

This year, we hired three interns aged 15 to 29 to design and lead 2 youth-centered activities that support wellbeing. They also created 17 videos to raise awareness of available services within the region.

Expanding our Reach to the 55+ Community

Building on our established activities in Aylmer, Shawville, and online, we have expanded our programming to Chelsea, Buckingham, and Wakefield. This expansion allows us to reach more seniors with a diverse range of activities and resources that promote social connection and personal growth.

Our Regional Senior's Coordinator has created numerous opportunities for seniors to connect, nurture their health and wellbeing, and explore their creativity. Programs like "Active Fun," "Jog Your Mind," and "Art 101" are just a few examples of the enriching activities that were offered this year. Additionally, we are thankful for our partnership with the Western Québec Literacy Council (WQLC), whose facilitation of workshop series such as "Cell Phone Security and Internet Research" in Aylmer, Shawville, and Buckingham has helped us enhance our community's digital literacy.

Special thanks to our community partners— Wakefield Golden Age Club, Centre Action Générations des Aînés, and the Anglican Parish of West Québec—for providing the space to host these engaging activities.



Providing Plain-Language Legal Information

To protect the rights and safeguard the wellbeing of our clientele, Connexions offered plain language information and resources through its Information and Referral Service.

Thanks to funding from Éducaloi, we also offered 5 legal information sessions with support from experts representing the Centre de justice de proximité de l'Outaouais (CJPO), the Centre d'assistance & d'accompagnement aux plaintes (CAAP) Outaouais, and the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA).

Outreach to Vulnerable Seniors through the Initiative de travail de milieu auprès des aînés vulnérables (ITMAV)

Through our ITMAV program, Connexions reached some of the most vulnerable seniors living within the Aylmer area of the City of Gatineau.

We provided support to 174 vulnerable seniors who faced challenges in accessing information on a wide range of services. Our Senior Outreach Worker provided 483 referrals to help seniors access the services they needed.

Services for Healthy Aging in the Right Place (SHARP) Webinars

The SHARP program, an initiative of the Community Health and Social Services Network (CHSSN), offers a wide range of health education programming.

This year, the CHSSN hosted six webinars covering topics such as Advanced Care Planning, Aging in Place, Treatment & Community Resources for Alzheimer's Disease, Fall Prevention Resources, Bridging the Loneliness Gap for Seniors Living in the Community, and information on what the CLSC can offer to help seniors maintain their independence as they age.

New Services for Caregivers

Thanks to funding from the CISSS de l'Outaouais, Connexions has expanded its caregiver services.

We established a working relationship with representatives from the Office d'habitation (OH) du Pontiac, which oversees 20 homes, to host Listening Circles in four communities, reaching 35 individuals.

We also established an accompaniment service, offering one-on-one support from two coaches, two relationship coaches, and one psychotherapist, and began planning a mentorship program to empower caregivers through peer support.

Additionally, we partnered with organizations like Le Bras Outaouais and AFIO (Accompagnement des femmes immigrantes de l'Outaouais) to improve service access for caregivers in minority and English-speaking communities, fostering community development through collaboration with regional partners.

Connexions is dedicated to supporting caregivers through a diverse range of workshops and conferences offered in both French and English. In total, we provided 7 workshops in French and 3 in English, focusing on essential themes such as helping caregivers identify their role, maintaining motivation, managing stress, and navigating life transitions. These sessions aimed to equip caregivers with practical tools and valuable insights to enhance their wellbeing and resilience.

These initiatives reflect Connexions' ongoing commitment to delivering accessible and comprehensive support to caregivers in our community.

Mental Health & Wellbeing Check-ins

This year, we introduced a new Mental Health & Wellness Check-In service. These free and confidential 30-minute calls provided individuals with a safe space to share their thoughts and feelings, and discuss their concerns without judgment, receiving a compassionate ear.

For those feeling overwhelmed, isolated or in need of additional support, Connexions referred them to available health and social services and community resources. Creating an environment of support and understanding helped our callers take the first step towards better mental health and wellbeing.


Where do our Inquirers Reside?




- Over half of inquiries were from residents of Gatineau (72%),


